Works requirements:

- Framed works or wall-mounted works: D-rings are essential
- Weight of works: no more than 20kg (including hanging mechanisms)
- For all screen-based works, artists must provide in the EOI a clear indication of
 what equipment/digital requirements will be. While every effort will be made to
 source display elements, including screens, media players etc., artists may need to
 provide their own equipment to show their work should they be selected for
 exhibition.

- It is the artist's responsibility to have all electrical items over the age of 12 months
 tested and tagged before delivery. It is the policy of Hive that works with untested
 and untagged electrical components will not be displayed with power on.
- Hive encourages artists to ensure that on delivery, artworks are:
 - wrapped with good quality reuseable wrapping materials to ensure their safe handling and protection. HIVE will return the works in the same way they were received; and
 - o the outside of the package is marked clearly with:
 - artist's name;
 - artist's mobile number;
 the direction it should travel in (ie. which way up); and "FRAGILE".
- Artworks must be ready to install and fitted with hanging fixtures (if relevant)
 that are appropriate for the weight of the work, all 2D artworks must be fitted with
 D-rings.
- Transport to and from HIVE is the responsibility of the artist to organise

Public and Education programs:

Hive Tasmania may from time to time create associated programming with selected exhibitions. Artists will be paid a separate presentation fee for these events which may include installations, talks, small and community exhibitions, other creative programming. This will be discussed following the selection process and nearer the time of confirmed exhibition.
